- Project start and end date
- Proposed tree species list

Planting project description

- Describe the area that you will be planting. Why have you selected this area? How will you plant the trees? Who will be involved?

Site preparation

- How will you prepare the area for planting?

Area to be planted

- Upload photos of area to be planted: aerial images of property and photos of planting site.

Please describe the ecological benefits expected from this planting

- e.g. habitat for bees; food sources for nectar-feeding insects, weed suppression, general environmental improvement etc.

Please describe the community benefits expected from this planting

- e.g. engagement with local volunteers, clubs, schools, environmental groups

Community involvement

- Please estimate the number of people who will engage with this garden and in doing so become aware of the importance of bees and other pollinators

What risks does your planting face, and how will you mitigate them?

- e.g. fire, livestock, pests, social conflict, land ownership change, etc.

How many years will you maintain the trees?

- e.g. conducting weed control, vermin removal, replacement of dead trees, fencing and livestock exclusion
